



Planters and Plant Care

Please feel free to remove the plant from the plastic pot and replant into the planter or you can leave the plant within the plastic pot.

Sansevieria

The sansevieria plant is pretty indestructible. It is best in bright, filtered light. The plant only needs to be watered once every few weeks. A larger sansevieria plant benefits from removing the plant within its plastic pot from the planter and popping the plant in a tray with a few inches of water and allowing the plant to soak up the water for around ten minutes.

Coral cactus

Despite its name, the Coral Cactus isn't actually a cactus at all - it's African succulent with a trunk that mimics the typical cactus, making it similar in appearance. Keep in mind that the Coral Cactus produces a sap, which should be cleaned off immediately to prevent skin irritation. Simply give your hands a quick wash after handling it. Also, keep the plant out of reach from children and pets. Water when the top few inches soil are dry. Do not over water.
